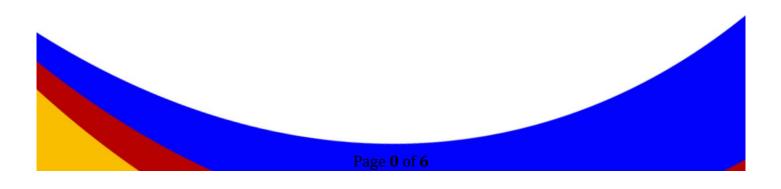

Honourable Speaker;

I stand before this council to deliver my first Budget Speech in the current administration. It is indeed a great honour and privilege to present to you our Budget for 2022/2023 financial year. This year we are embarking on a re-energised and service delivery-focused journey with the multiparty coalition government of the Thabazimbi Local Municipality.

Our administration represents the collective choice by our residents to install a multiparty coalition government to represent their needs and fast-track service delivery.

Our residents have entrusted us with an important duty when they exercised their voting power to place an important responsibility upon us to restore stability and drive quality and sustainable service delivery in the whole of Thabazimbi Local Municipality.

Thabazimbi Local Municipality was a recipient of MIG, INEP and WSIG funding during the 2021/22 financial year and has successfully implemented the following projects:

- > Regorogile Ext 5 Paving of internal streets Phase 3
- Upgrading of Stormwater management system at Regorogile.
- ▶ Upgrading of Northam Cemetery.

- > Upgrading of Rooiberg Cemetery.
- ➢ Raphuti Installation of Highmast Lights.
- Electrification of Meriting Informal Settlement Phase 1 and 2.

TABLING OF BUDGET 2022/2023 FINANCIAL YEAR

The budgeted revenue for the 2022/23 financial year is projected to be R465 million and the budgeted expenditure for the 2022/23 financial year is R434 million. We will be receiving operational grants to the amount of R126.4 million for the next financial year.

These operational grants comprise of the Equitable Share; Financial Management Grant (FMG) and the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP). Our capital budget consists of three grants namely, the Municipal Infrastructure Grant (MIG); the Water Services Infrastructure Grant (WSIG) and the Integrated National Electrification Programme (INEP). The following projects will be funded through these grants:
